First Sentence	Does not answer the questions of who, what, when or where. Words are misspelled and punctuation is missing.	Answers the questions of who, what, when, and where. Words are spelled correctly and punctuation is used properly.	Creatively answers the questions of who, what, when, and where. Words are spelled correctly and punctuation is used correctly.
Second Sentence	Does not answer the questions of why or how. Quotes from individuals are non-descript or missing altogether. Words are misspelled and punctuated improperly.	Answers the questions of why or how or incorporates a brief descriptive quote. Words are spelled correctly. Punctuation is correct.	Creatively answers the questions of why or how or incorporates and emotion-filled personalized quote. Words are spelled correctly. Punctuation is correct.
Lazy Information	Ambiguous information is present.	References to specific information is not present but is not inaccurate.	Information referred to is specific, clear and accurate.
Weak Words	Weak verbs tie the sentences together.	One or two weak words are present, generating a stagnant feel to the caption.	Weak words are replaced with emotive, action-oriented verbs which lead the reader through the caption.
