<b>Eyeline</b>	No Eyeline Exists	A semblance of an eyeline exists, but elements do not build off it consistently.	A one-pica eyeline exists in the top or bottom third of the spread. Elements build off the eyeline consistently or if they break the eyeline they break it by more than 4 picas.
<b>Dominant Element</b>	No element on the page commands attention.	An average photo draws attention, or a slightly smaller photo battles for a not-big enough photo's presence.	One excellent photo draws attention and leads the viewer's eye to other elements on the page.
<b>Column Structure</b>	Elements on the page do not begin and end on columns, rather the elements stagger around without contributing to the design.	Most elements begin and end on a column.	Every element begins and ends on a column. Some elements span multiple columns.
<b>Interior Margins</b>	Interior Margins are haphazard and not consistent.	Interior margins between elements are mostly consistent.	Interior margins between elements are always consistent.
<b>Photo Size Variety</b>	Most Photos are the same size and shape.	Mostly horizontal or mostly vertical photos are used and limit variety in design.	Horizontal, vertical, and square photos are used to provide variety in design
